

**2006 First Quarter Community Improvement Award Winners:
Alison and John Boardman -- 30 Golf View Circle NE**

John and Alison began work on this Tudor style (top photo) residence one year ago. Replaced items include: the roof, insulation, electrical, plumbing, air-conditioning, interior walls, doors, flooring and kitchen, exterior doors, windows and walls. The landscaping includes: removing 2-tons of existing yard debris, new sod, irrigation, 50-trees and shrubs. The estimated cost of this project is \$120,000.

**2006 Second Quarter Community Improvement Award Winner:
1801-11th St. NE**

Kari and Wolfgang began work on this 1917 Southern Colonial Salt Box style residence one year ago. Replaced items include: completely replacing all the bathrooms, kitchen, refurbished the wooden floors, refurbished the exterior doors and windows. The landscaping includes: new sod, irrigation, 12 trees, 1,000 shrubs and small cover plants, one fountain, outdoor lighting, new decking and paver bricks driveway with integral lighting. The estimated cost of the project was \$110,000.

**2006 Third Quarter Residential Beautification Council Award Winners:
Sergio and Andrea Cruz – 523 7th St. NE**

Sergio and Andrea Cruz began work on this 1926 Frame Vernacular style residence five (5) years ago by completely restoring the wooden frame windows with new sash cords and removing eight (8) layers of paint. Other improvements include: additional insulation, new exterior paint, new electrical, and completely refurbishing the bathrooms. The landscaping includes: a truckload of mulch, two (2) trees and 150 plants and shrubs designed to attract butterflies and hummingbirds. The estimated cost of the project was \$30,000.

**2006 Third Quarter Commercial Beautification Council Award Winner:
Tandem Health Care of Winter Haven**

The new landscaping and therapy gardens at Tandem Health Care of Winter Haven took approximately six (6) months to complete. A list of improvements include: 85 small plants and shrubs, mulch, and outdoor lighting, a fountain, outdoor benches, resulting in a therapy garden for patients. A new walkway was constructed with different textured surfaces to aid walking and wheelchair therapy patients. The estimated cost of this project was \$7,500.
